OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.







SAINT ANTHONY MARY CLARET PATRON OF ST. CLARET SCHOOL



The School is named after its Heavenly Patron, St Anthony Mary Claret, a 19th Century Catholic Archbishop of Cuba and Founder of the Roman Catholic Congregation of the Claretian Missionaries.

Anthony Claret (born on December 23, 1807) was a native of Sallent in Spain and was a successful businessman. However, riches and success did not satisfy him and he left his worldly pursuits in response to God's call. Burning with love for God and fellow human beings, he became a priest and then founded a congregation for priests, deacons and brothers to spread the message of God's love for humanity and the need for human beings to love God and neighbors. He sought to serve God and people using "all means possible". He was a profound teacher. He taught through his sermons and lectures, innumerable writings and exhortations. He was a social reformer. He initiated innovative undertakings for the uplift of the poor and the marginalized, to bring them to the mainstream of the society. He was a visionary. He designed and implemented original projects for agricultural and industrial development of the society. He was a prophet with genuine spiritual courage. He denounced unhealthy and oppressive structures and practices of the times and called for a return to spiritual and moral values. Above all, he was a caring spiritual father and symbol of God's love for the people. Persecuted and exiled, he died on October 24, 1870. He was canonized a Saint in 1950 by Pope Pius XII.



THE CLARETIANS

St Claret School/College is established by the Claretian Missionaries under the Province of Bangalore of the Claretian Congregation of the Catholic Priests, Deacons and Brothers. The Congregation of Claretian Missionaries (also called Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary) was founded on July 16, 1849 by Saint Anthony Mary Claret, in Spain. At present, there are over 3000 Claretians working in 63 countries. On fire with love for God and for the fellow human beings, they engage in pastoral, social and educational endeavors for the promotion of human life and dignity. In India, there are over 600 Claretians working in eleven states. They serve the poor and the marginalized through pastoral and spiritual animation, educational endeavors, care for the leprosy-affected, drug addicts, aids patients, ex-prisoners, the blind, the differentially-abled, tribals and dalits. In India, they run more than 35 educational institutions, and dozens of village schools in the remote parts of the country which include schools, colleges and institutes of higher learning.

- 1. To provide value-based, meaningful and productive education.
- 2. To offer traditional, professional and employment oriented regular courses and innovative add-on courses that will equip the youngsters for effective and fruitful personal and professional lives.
- 3. To provide on-going training, research and documentation at the service of knowledge and life enhancement, and community and nation building.
- 4. To create a scientific temper, research rigor, holistic vision and leadership skills at the service of building up a better society.
- 5. To impart basic human values of peace, love, justice, compassion, community mindedness and a life of gratitude in the younger generation.

PARENTAL ROLE AND OBLIGATIONS TOWARDS THE CHILD


"Humanity's great hope is that parents will act for the best, if they have awareness and are on the side of the child in his development towards freedom in work, development of knowledge and love."

- 1. Parents need to cultivate objectivity in accepting their children on the basis of their inner potential and provide maximum enrichment opportunities towards their betterment. More personal attention and supervisory guidance at study, rather than dependence on external tutoring would consolidate the parent child relationship as one that is based on friendship and counseling.
- 2. Timely interaction of parents with the school authorities, and teacher concerned is necessary to maximize the child's potential and performance.
- 3. Parents should refrain from violating personal rights of their children and instill a sense of initiative, motivation and enthusiasm to pursue their goals in this competitive world around us.
- 4. Parents should offer timely support, encouragement, love and above all discernment between freedom and licenses, sanctions and withdrawals should be based on sound casual reasoning, and awareness of the consequences of unacceptable behaviour, and not on punitive grounds, or on the authoritarian basis of parenthood.
- 5. It naturally follows that a parent then is a friend, a confidant, an inspirer, who should build self-esteem, confidence, critical thinking in their children.
- 6. A changed concept of time and its utilization the parents should incorporate in the children at home. Creating time for recreation and entertainment, judicious use of medias, study habits and homework completion with supervisory guidance should be parental contribution towards building a balanced personality.
- 7. Parents should develop courage and ability to cope with academic demands, emotional and psychological stress and failures in children.
- 8. Character formation scientific reasoning, religion and its interpretation and application to life in the correct perspective should be the foundations which parents ought to establish for their children.
- 9. Parents should instill in their children, the qualities of learning to share, to serve, to empathize and to be compassionate, sensitive and sensible.



PARENTS RESPONSIBILITIES TOWARDS THE SCHOOL

- 1. The Principal can be met usually between 9.30 and 10.30 AM or by appointment. Co-operation is indispensable for the proper education of children. Parents are requested to keep in touch with the school authorities about their children's progress frequently. Parents are also requested to do their part in enforcing study habit, regularity and discipline in their children.
- 2. To get the Progress report parents should come on the prescribed date and the remark may be taken special note of.
- 3. Parents should maintain the report card.
- 4. Parents should read and sign the message sent to them from time to time through the students by the teacher or the principal in the diary. They should also acknowledge in the calendar circulars or letters sent to them from time to time.
- 5. Teachers and pupils are strictly forbidden to receive visitors during class hours.
- 6. Parents can meet the teachers at 2.30 PM on week days and on Saturdays at 1 PM with prior appointment. Parents/guardians and others may not meet students or their teachers during the school hours. This is enforced strictly so that the students may not loose the class hours and the teachers may complete the teaching on time.
- 7. The parents/guardians may not meet students or teachers in the school premises without permission.
- 8. Parents and guardian should bring any complaints to the principal and not to the teachers directly.
- 9. Parents who want to take the result / take home the ward during the school hours / to meet the class teachers should produce the parents ID card. Without this, permission for the above may not be granted.
- 10. All the parents should submit a family photo to the school for the safety measures and record.

- 11. Parents are requested to go through the calendar carefully and make a study of the rules and regulations. The diary part of the calendar contains the home —work the students are expected to do at home.
- 12. Encourage the children that they should do their home work by themselves. They should not be helped in it by you or by tutors, unless they really need it, It is important that the children develop a habit of study and work on their own. Parents are reminded that engaging private tutors for their children may prove injurious to their progress in studies. Hence no students may take private tuitions in any subject especially from the teachers of his/her school without first consulting the principal.
- 13. Parents are contacted on telephone only in case of emergencies such as serious injury, accidents, taking ill suddenly etc., and not to inform them about the ordinary disciplinary measures taken against their wards. Parents are expected to intimate to the school any changes in residential address and contact nos.
- 14. Criticism of a teacher should be avoided in the presence of the child because it undermines his/her respect for the teachers. If you have legitimate complaint, please bring it to the notice of the principal. Any such complaint made to him will be most welcome, as this could help in the better functioning of the school.
- 15. You are requested to pay special attention to the personal cleanliness of your child and that he/she attends the school in the prescribed uniform. As the 'medium of Instruction in this school is English, children should be helped to follow their class easily and intelligently by a certain amount of regular, English conversations even at home.
- 16. If a child is absent without valid permission for more than 10 days, his name will be struck off the rolls. However he may be re-admitted provided the seat is still vacant by paying the re-admission fee.



- 17. Parents have to buy a minimum of two pairs of school Uniform made for your child.
- 18. Parents are expected to do their part in enforcing regularity and discipline. They should see that the children prepare their lessons. They should see that the children especially in the higher classes devote about two hours in the morning and two hours in the evening to study. They are requested to go through the answer scripts of all tests and examinations and sign them. If the children do not show the answer scripts they are requested to contact the class teacher.
- 19. Parents/guardian are informed that the reports and messages sent by teachers in the calendar should be read and signed. Failure to do so may put their children to great inconvenience.
- 20. Parents/guardians should make it a point to visit the school and meet the principal at least once a month and compulsorily during report card days to enquire about the progress of their children.
- 21. It may be kindly noted that the children will not be sent home in even in emergency with anyone who might come for them during school hours without ID card of the parents.
- 22. The school authorities will not be responsible for anything happening to a student of any class before school hours or after school hours. Parents/Guardian must take this matter seriously and see that their child/ ward comes to school in time and reaches home soon after the classes are over.
- 23. If any student loses any article, the school authorities will not be responsible. Apart from study materials no other valuables must be brought to school.
- 24. Students who bring unwanted items like cutters / sharp materials / scissors.... Will be sent back home with immediate effect.

- 25. When teachers call for the meeting of the parents, the parents should respond positively so that the child's growth can be monitored.
- 26. Parents' are to remember that their cooperation and collaboration is very much required in the daily running of the school. When the parents come to the school for any official work, the parents are requested to bring the Parents ID.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

No leave of absence is granted except on Previous Written Application from parents or guardian and that too only for serious reasons which should be mentioned. In case of illness, a leave application with medical certificate should be sent written on the diary.

ABSENCE WITHOUT LEAVE LETTER

Absence without leave letter for one continuous period of 10 days will lead to the removal of the students from the school. Medical certificate to be submitted for sick leave.

No Students who has been absent from school or is late to the school will be admitted to class without a note of excuse from the parent / guardian and the principal's signature in diary.



ATTENDANCE

- 1. All students require minimum 85% attendance to be eligible for examination and promotion
- 2. If pupils, for some unexplained reasons, are absent from school for more than 10 days their names will be struck off from the rolls, and as a rule they are not re-admitted.
- 3. Leave of absence may be granted to a pupil for sufficient causes but only on previous application, for which space is provided in the manual. As a rule not more than 2 days leave of absence is granted.
- 4. If a pupil is absent due to illness or any other reason the principal must be informed immediately and the pupil on returning to school must bring a note from the parent or guardian stating the reason for absence on the special page provided in the manual. In case of illness a medical certificate is essential.
- 5. All the teachers & Pupil must be present on the opening day & the closing day of each term.

HOUSE SYSTEM

This is an age of the fitness and hence healthy competitions have become the keyword of success. So the students are divided into different houses. Each house has a captain, a vice – captain and a few teachers animators. - 7. Expensive gifts or cakes on student's birthday will be sent back.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. Students are strictly forbidden to take part in any political activity.
- 2. Every Student should look after his/her own belongings. Pupils are responsible for the safe custody of their books and belongings.
- 3. No one should scratch or spoil desks, benches, chairs or damage any school furniture. Pupil should avoid defacing the walls or floor of the school by writing or drawing anything on them. Waste papers must be deposited in the waste paper basket.
- 4. Any damage done to the school property will have to be compensated by those responsible for it. The decision of the principal regarding the amount will be final.
- 5. No unwanted books, newspapers, periodicals, (other than text books) or transistors, gold ornaments, watches should be brought to school without the approval of the principal. The school will not be responsible for the loss of such items.
- 6. Disrespect to the authority and Dishonesty will be penalized by expulsion from the school.



PRINCIPAL'S SANCTION REQUIRED FOR THE FOLLOWING

- 1. To make a collection for any purpose whatsoever by the student or by the teacher.
- 2. To arrange for a meeting, a party, a picnic etc.
- 3. To leave the school premise during the working hours.
- 4. For any students to join a sport meet or to play in a tournament outside the School during school hours / on behalf of the school.
- 5. To arrange for private tuition by the teachers of our school.
- 6. No teacher is allowed to take tuition for their own class / subject students what so ever may be the reason.
- 7. For any parent or visitor to meet pupils or teachers during the working hours.
- 8. To be absent on the opening day and the closing day.

DISCIPLINE

Strict regularity, implicit obedience, courtesy in speech and conduct, cleanliness of dress and person and respectful behavior towards the school authorities and the members of the staff at all times are expected from each student.

Hence, in case of irregular attendance, habitual idleness, unsatisfactory application to studies, disobedience, indiscipline, and objectionable moral influence in and out of school, parents will be intimated before any action is taken.

FEES

All the fees may be paid on monthly basis / installment at (Indian Bank, Butibori) (Bank of India, MIDC, Butibori branch), (Central bank, MIDC), (Federal Bank, Butibori) (ICICI Bank Butibori). No other bank or bank branches are acceptable because the counterfoil of the pay in slip from the other banks are not available in the school to update the fees record. All the fees are revisable.

- 1. The fees should be paid from the 1 to 15 of every month without fail. Late fee: Rs. 20 will be payable from 16th to 30th of every month.
- **2.** Fees are accepted only in the banks mentioned above and not in the school. Banks will accept only cash or the same bank cheque.
- **3.** Fees may also be paid in advance for the whole year.
- **4.** Fees will not be accepted unless duly filled in pay in slip, (on all three portions) with regard to student's Name, Admission number, Class & Section etc. is produced in the bank.
- **5.** Counterfoils must be retained minimum for one year, as they serve as official receipt & proof.
- **6.** Fees will be accepted during normal business hours of the banks.
- 7. Any alteration / addition of Amount in the Fee Booklet will not be accepted by the Bank, unless it is counter signed by the Manager/Principal of St. Claret School.
- **8.** In case the fee booklet is misplaced / lost, please inform the school authority immediately and obtain the duplicate fee Booklet.
- **9.** All the Fees (From May to April) should be paid before the commencement of the Annual examination, ie. Before 15th March.

Fee Payment

School Bus

- 1. All students using the school bus are expected to be at least five minutes before the arrival time of the bus.
- 2. Buses will not wait for the late comers.
- 3. Children are advised to stay away from the main road till the bus arrives.
- 4. There will not be any extra stop for any student.

LIBRARY RULES

- 1. Silence shall be strictly observed in library.
- 2. Rare books, Reference books are generally not issued.
- 3. After using books/ newspaper/magazine/ journal should be kept at proper/ allotted places.
- 4. Books in special demand may be lent for a shorter period as decided by the librarian.
- 5. If a student damages or looses books or other properties of the library, the user shall replace such books or other properties damaged or make payments for the value thereof.
- 6. Every user shall sign the issue register while taking and returning the books.
- 7. User must satisfy themselves about the physical condition of the books before borrowing otherwise they shall held responsible for held damage or mutilation notice at the time of returning.
- 8. A user who repeatedly fails to return books on due date may not be lent any books as decided by the librarian.
- 9. An overdue charge of Rs. 5/- per book per day will be charged if a book is kept beyond the due date.
- 10. Every student is issued a book for a week, it is expected that the student reads the book at home as an activity. Parents are requested to ensure that the child reads the book every week so as to cultivate reading habits in the child.



Examination & Promotion

- 1. There will be two Class Test & two Evaluations for Class 1-5. Two Periodic Test and two Term Examination for Class 6-8 & three Periodic Test and Final Examination for Class 9 & 10 during one academic year. Promotion to next class is strictly on the basis of the average marks of the above mentioned exams as per the CBSE rules. To avoid unhealthy competition among the students to secure a particular rank and to broaden their outlook the students will be rewarded 'grades' in the various examination conducted by the school.
- **2.** Parents can see the answer sheets of all the exams except annual examination on every first Saturdays. Please check the dates with the diary.
- **3.** A pupil failing twice in the same class will not be permitted to continue his / her studies in the same school.
- **4.** Students are engaged not to be absent in any examination. In case of illness a doctor's certificate must be obtained.
- **5.** No special examination will be held for any reason whatsoever before the examination schedule.
- **6.** A student found copying, helping others to copy during an examination or doing any malpractice will be disqualified.
- 7. All promotions will be done in conformity with the instruction issued by the education department / board.
- **8.** There is no provision for a re-evaluation. But this can be requested during the report card day when the parents check the papers.
- **9.** If the students do not have 85% of attendance the student will not be promoted to higher class.


NURSERY ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- **1.** A child above 36 months of age is admitted to Nursery. Generally admission is available only in the nursery classes because the rest of the classes are full.
- **2.** Admission: Registration for admission in the school to Nursery notification will be published in advance in all the notice boards and at the entrance to facilitate the parents to do the needful in advance.
- **3.** Admission process: The admission form available only in the school office. Fill in the admission forms & other relevant documents & meet the principal on the day of appointment. Original birth certificate and the Xerox Copy of the Original Birth Certificate duly countersigned is essential. Both the parents must be present for the admission. Three (3) pass port size photos and the family photo of 5×3 size must be submitted along with the application form.
- **4.** Admission form, hand book and identity card are to be received from the school.
- **5.** School does not entertain any recommendation.
- **6.** All admission transactions are done directly in the school office only. For all the payments done in the school, the school will issue an official receipt. Parents are requested to preserve this receipt for further reference.



ADMISSION & WITHDRAWAL

- **1.** Admission to all the other classes are done as per the availability of seats and on merit basis. A vacancy notice will be placed by March / April on the notice board for the information of the public.
- **2.** Withdrawals: A month's request notice is required before a student can be withdrawn from the school. Those who leave the school must pay all the fees of the year to obtain the TC.
- **3.** School leaving / transfer certificate from the school last attended counter signed by the education officer.
- **4.** Original birth certificate to be produced.
- **5.** Report of progress and co-curricular activities in the school previously attended.
- **6.** No change in the date of birth of the students will be permitted once the student is admitted.
- 7. Students must fulfill the following minimum age requirement for granting admission as on 31st of July of the admission year.
